

VOLUNTEER AGREEMENT FORM

Volunteering at *Anne Frank in the World* is an experience that enriches the lives of our visitors but yours as well. Your commitment to *Anne Frank in the World* helps educate people about the lessons of the Holocaust. Volunteers can commit to serve as a docent, greeter, assist with administrative support and at special events. Volunteers will receive a monthly e-newsletter, and have special access to library resources and current events.

Volunteer Expectations

Volunteers are expected to recount Anne Frank's story to the public in an unbiased manner that reflects the educational mission of the exhibit and as directed by the Anne Frank Center USA. Volunteers are expected to:

Represent the Georgia Commission on the Holocaust and the City of Sandy Springs in a professional way

Demonstrate knowledge on the subject and present information accurately

Be reliable and maintain volunteer commitment of four (4) hours monthly

Accept constructive criticism

Attend volunteer orientations, trainings and enrichments

Refrain from discussing personal, religious or political beliefs with visitors

Shadow other docent tours for a minimum of three (3) times before conducting independent tours

Supervision and Evaluation

All volunteers will be trained and supervised by a staff member of the Commission. For a docent, the first four tours are designated as a probationary period and a greeter will also be evaluated during the first thirty days to determine if he/she is appropriate for the position.
