**Jennifer Teege**, Author of *My Grandfather Would Have Shot Me: A Black Woman Discovers Her Family's Nazi Past*

Join us for a conversation exploring what author Jennifer Teege has learned from the shocking discovery that she is a descendant of Amon Goeth, the brutal Nazi commandant of Plaszow. The daughter of a German mother and Nigerian father, she was placed in a children's home when she was four weeks old and was in her late 30s when she first learned of her family's complex history. In a discussion with Museum Historian Dr. Edna Friedberg, Teege will share what she has learned from firsthand conversations with survivors who suffered the brutality of her grandfather and how these crimes continue to shape our understanding of hatred and violence today.
