## TO THE HOLOCAUST

On April 11, 1945 William Alexander Scott III entered Buchenwald concentration camp. He was a segregated reconnaissance sergeant, photographer, camoufleur and part-time historian in S2 (Intelligence Section) of the 183rd Engineer Combat Battalion in the 8th Corps of General George S. Patton's 3rd Army. Through the lens of his camera, he witnessed the atrocities of the Holocaust. His photos are official evidence of the crimes for which the Nazis were responsible. Some of these photographs and Scott's eyewitness account are included in the travelling exhibit "Witness to the Holocaust: WWII Veteran William Alexander Scott III at Buchenwald."


